Cody Howell "Laptops for College" Scholarship

- A. 1,500 word essay that would inspire a quadriplegic.
Example: Pretend you are asked to come and speak to a group of quadriplegics. What would you tell them so they would become inspired? **Example:** If you were writing a letter to a quadriplegic what would you tell them to give them hope and inspiration?

Daugherty Family Scholarship

- A. GPA minimum of 2.0
B. Priority shall be given to those students who have shown superior motivation and industry who, for financial reason, may not have the opportunity to continue their education.
C. Must carry a full-time load of classes at any accredited institution.

Monroe Community Scholarship

- A. Same as Daugherty Family Scholarship (see above)

Diamond Woods Scholarship

- A. No minimum GPA.
B. Priority shall be given to those students who show financial need. Provide a copy of your EFC from the FAFSA.
C. Must carry a minimum of 6 credit hours.

F.A.R.M. Scholarship

- A. No minimum GPA required.
B. Must plan to pursue a career in agriculture or ag support. This must be documented in the application essay.
C. Must enroll in an accredited college or community college, or in an ag-related technical/trade school.

Laura Smith Memorial Scholarship

- A. Minimum GPA of 2.0.
B. Need to have done volunteering in your community.
C. Special consideration may be given to applicants with an interest in pursuing a career in education.

Monroe Classified Scholarship

- A. Minimum GPA 2.5.
B. Involvement in school and community activities.
C. Provide a copy of your EFC from the FAFSA.

Scott/Tyler Heritage Scholarship

- A. Complete essay "If I had scholarship money to continue my education past high school, I would..."
B. Minimum GPA of 2.0 and Maximum GPA of 3.0.
C. Must be eligible to receive a high school diploma from MHS by the date of graduation in the year the scholarship is granted.
D. Priority will be given to students attending an accredited college, community college, technical or trade school in the state of Oregon.
E. Demonstrate financial need.

- A. Open to current graduates and previous graduates
B. GPA minimum of 2.0
C. Non-working students must carry a full-time class load (12 graded credits).
D. Working students must carry a minimum of half-time class load (6 graded credits) and prove employment by providing copies of pay stubs along with grade report.
E. May attend any accredited college, university or trade school.
F. Can reapply the school year directly after the first year.

Monroe Tree Farm Scholarship - Due March 1st **Apply via OSAC application HERE**

- A. Open to current graduates and previous graduates
B. GPA minimum of 2.0
C. Students must carry a full-time class load (12 graded credits).
D. May attend any accredited college, university or trade school.
E. Can reapply the school year directly after the first year.

Lois Braswell Scholarship - Due March 12th **Apply via attached application**

- A. Funded by the Ralph Hull Foundation
B. GPA minimum of 2.0
C. Must carry a full-time class load (12 credit hours)
D. Turn in separate application to the school counselor.

Class of 1970 Memorial Award - Due April 23rd **Apply via attached application**

- A. Open to a graduating senior at Monroe High School.
B. Must have participated in vocational education/ industrial arts classes at MHS.
